If you have an e-mail address, please drop me a note at billvt@together.net and I will add you to the chapter e-mail list if you are not included already.

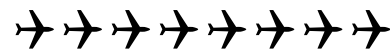
Good Time

To date we have the following member reporting Young Eagle flights.

Our goal for Young Eagle flights for 2002 is 240. If we have a good year and everything goes OK, we should make it. We have only two more years to fly Young Eagles to make our goal of 1,000,000 by the end of December 2003.



Despite all that happened in the last five months of 2001, Young Eagles volunteers flew 98,449 Young Eagles. We were just under our projections for the year. Our goal for 2001 was 107,000 Young eagle flights.

This year we have set our sights high. We hope to fly 120,000 Young Eagles in 2002. We are asking each pilot in the program to increase participation by 20% over last year. For example, I flew 86 Young Eagles last year – so I have to fly 104 for 2002.

The vapor trail left in the sky by an airplane is called a contrail which is a contraction of the words Condensation Trail.

Safety Tip's

It's that time of year. Spring is here, it's time to have fun but remember "SAFETY" is number one.

I can see no harm refueling your airplane with 5 gal. cans but it has to be done right. I bought four 5 gal. plastic containers especially for the airplane and one plastic funnel that keeps out dirt and water. Get the gas from a station that has a quick turnover and use a popular brand. Your plane has got to have an STC for auto fuel.

There are two:

1. EAA – use unleaded 87 octane only
2. Peterson – use unleaded 87 octane or regular 89 octane

Don't forget, contamination is your worst enemy.

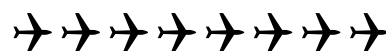
